AIMS OF THE PROJECT



SEAL The "Sustainable Environment for the Aquatic Life – SEAL" European Solidarity Corps Volunteering Teams in High Priority Areas project is dedicated to the monk seal (monachus monachus) which has been extinct in the Black Sea since it was last seen in 1997.

The aims of the project:

- Mourning for the monk seal (monachus monachus) which is extinct in the Black Sea and making their sad story known by everyone
- Alarming the authorities and the public for the endangered dolphins, which are now the head of the food chain in the ecosystem of the Black Sea after the extinction the monk seal (monachus monachus),
- to take action to save them from the extinction in the Black Sea as well as to save all the other species in the Black Sea
- Pointing out the types of the pollutants, all anthropogenic, the Black Sea is being exposed to all the time and their pathways to human health
- Highlighting the disrupted marine ecosystem in the Black Sea as other victims of the war in Ukraine
- Unveiling the hidden truth the waste which lies

beneath the surface of the Black Sea with underwater filming showing the waste lying on the seafloor

- Having a big impact on the waste of the Black Sea by collecting the waste from the sea floor with scuba diving and snorkelling activities as a different approach as well as with beach cleaning and exhibition of the waste removed from the sea floor
- Having a big impact not only for the crying Black Sea but also for the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea and the Atlantic Ocean which are also exposed to pollution
- Promoting the European Green Deal and the Sustainable Development Goals

WORKING PROGRAM AND TASKS OF VOLUTEERS



The Working Program:

The days starts at 09.30 at Karakum Beach or at Hal Meeting Center. For the artists, working location is Hal Meeting Point

- * The volunteers will work minimum **3 hours** in the morning and minimum **3 hours** in the afternoon.
- * Before they leave for their homes, there will be a **one-hour session** to meet their **mentors** in turns.
- * The ones who are not scheduled to meet their mentors will have a **self-evaluation** or a **reflection session** with the others or talk with their sending organisations to give them feedback.
- * Saturdays and Sundays will be off days

1st week: Orientation and preparation.

2nd week: Beach cleaning and waste collecting with snorkelling.

3rd week: Waste collecting with scuba diving and snorkelling.

4th week: Preparation for the exhibition.

5th week: Exhibition and evaluation.

Orientation of the volunteers:

*With the 28 volunteers from 7 different countries, we will start with getting to know each other and **team building activities**.

*Volunteers will organise **cultural nights**

*The instructors from the university will give you a lecture about the pollution of the Black Sea and its pathways to human health.

*The mentors will identify themselves and all the volunteers will have their own mentor. They will schedule their regular meetings but the mentors will be available anytime to meet or talk in case the volunteer needs.

*The artist volunteers will observe the town, make researches and interact with the people to get inspired to present the exhibition after the waste collecting activities









WORKING PROGRAM AND TASKS OF VOLUTEERS



Beach cleaning and waste collecting with snorkelling.

The scuba diver volunteers will participate in beach cleaning and waste collecting with snorkelling in the most polluted areas. The municipality will provide us with huge garbage bags and a garbage vehicle for the excessive waste to be transferred to the waste processing installation. The artist volunteers will also accompany them and start designing their artworks.

Collecting the waste from the bottom of the Sinop shores with scuba diving activities:

- * There will be **16 scuba divers as volunteers.**
- * In the beginning of the diving week, the instructors will give them brief information about diving in a classroom just to remind them all the rules and the technique. Each scuba diver volunteer has to show their scuba licence which will be either 2-star CMAS or EFR & PADI Diver level.
- * Volunteers will dive **in pairs**. So, there will be **8 pairs** of scuba divers. There will be **one scuba** diving instructor, who will be the academician from the university, for **2 pairs**. Also there will be one extra scuba diver instructor who will be responsible for the whole group. So there will be **5 instructors** in total.

Each scuba diver (volunteer) will be responsible for their buddy and each instructor will be responsible for their 2 pairs of scuba divers (volunteers).

* The volunteers will not dive deeper than 35 metres. The instructors will make the diving plan and the volunteers will follow their diving plans. The instructors will take you to the safest locations in the

proper weather and sea condition to collect the waste from the bottom of the sea.

- * One of the scuba divers (volunteer) will use an underwater camera, to record the waste under water and waste collecting activities under water.
- ***While the scuba divers are under water, the artists will be on shore to clean the beaches or design their artistic works. During this week, the artist volunteers will be scheduled to take model boat making courses.***







WORKING PROGRAM AND TASKS OF VOLUTEERS



Exhibitions of the waste collected from the sea floor.

- * There will be **12 artist volunteers**.
- * They will work on **presenting** the **waste collected** from the **seafloor** and **the beach** to the public by using their artistic and aesthetic talents with an exhibition at the end of their activity. **The exhibition** will remain **one week** in the public area.

The artist volunteers will be responsible for the safety of their art works and giving information to the public.

- * During the exhibition, there will be at least one scuba diver volunteer who will be ready to talk with the public to explain their experience under water.
- * In the exhibition, there will also be the **photos of waste** which will be taken under water, **the sad story** of our extinct mammal, **monk seal** and the **promotional materials** of the **Sustainable Development Goals.**





Media team

*We will make at 1 long (30 minutes) and 1 short films (5 minutes). The films will show the waste on the seafloor, scuba diving instructors' speech about the pollution of the Black Sea and the volunteers working on their tasks, information about the extinct monk seal (monachus monachus), exhibition of the waste, reflection of the people who will see the waste exhibition, interviewing old local people, especially the fishermen.

*Volunteers will help with taking photos and videos for the films and also for social media content.

Mentor meetings and daily evaluations:

Mentor meetings and daily evaluations are essential in order to help the development of the volunteers and activities as well as to measure our progress and prevent any kinds of risks. Mentors will be working with the volunteers as well as guiding and helping them with their needs.

They will also intervene if any kinds of difficulties, problems, misunderstandings, culture or language related issues, etc. arise and they will find solutions and maintain the motivation of the volunteer. There will also be scheduled mentor meeting sessions that only the volunteer and the mentor will meet.

The ones who are not scheduled to meet their mentors will have a self-evaluation or a reflection session with the others or talk with their sending organisations to give them feedback.





OTHER ACTIVITES



Model boat making courses:

Sinop has been the shelter for the sailors because of its geographic form as a natural port against the fierce storms of



the Black Sea throughout the history. Over a period of approximately 2,500 years, Sinop has been settled by Colchians, Greeks, Romans and Turks and the witness of the sea trades as

well as the tragic naval wars. Since it was strategically located among the trade routes, sailing and seamanship were prominent in history. We can trace the sea culture in the history from the sarcophaguses to amphoras excavated and exposed in the Archaeological Museum of Sinop now. From the second half of the 4th century BC, Sinop was an important shipbuilding center especially for the Ottoman Navy until the Treaty of Paris signed on 30th March 1856 between Russia on one side and France, Great Britain, Sardinia-Piedmont, and the Ottoman Empire on the other. With this treaty, the Black Sea was demilitarised and battle shipbuilding stopped in Sinop and this craftsmanship was moved to the Marmara Region. The fishing boat building remained until now by only one craftsman who inherited this talent from his ancestors and the

model boat making craft remained. There are only a few craftsmen of model boats in Sinop and they are selling and exporting these model boats.

We would like to deliver this unique talent to our volunteers. While scuba diver volunteers are under water, the artist volunteers will take the model boat making courses. During the preparation of the exhibition, the scuba diver volunteers will help the artist volunteers and they will also take model boat making courses.

Boat trip and excursions to the waterfalls: In the 2 nd week, we will organise them a boat trip which will show you the beautiful shores of the Sinop region by the sea and another day you will have a hiking and climbing experience in Tatlica Waterfalls, 42 km to Sinop, where there are 28 small

waterfalls in cascade, included in the list of nature parks by the Ministry of Forestry of Turkiye.

Accomodation

We will rent apartments for the volunteers for 37 days. In each apartment, there can be 3 to 5 volunteers, The volunteer will share a 2 beds bedroom with other volunteers. The apartment will have a bathroom, washing machine, kitchen and access to WI-FI













Travel

All volunteers should arraive in Sinop on the **30th of June** and leave on the **7th of August**.

Pocket and travel money are **851 EUR**. It's up to you how you can travel here. You can either take a plane, a bus or a train to Istanbul. From Istanbul, you can come here either by bus or plane. There is no train to Sinop.

However we recommend you to take the cheapest means of transportation to keep your money with yourselves.

If you still would like to take a plane, you should first come to Istanbul and then take the Sinop flight. There are two airports in İstanbul. Be careful when you book your domestic flight.

During the summer there will be two flights everyday between Istanbul and Sinop, which take 1 hour and 15 min.

From Ankara you can take a bus to Sinop from AŞTİ (Ankara Bus Station), which takes 6 hours.

From İstanbul you can also take a bus to Sinop

if you arrive in the European side take Havaist Bus to the Esenler Otogar (İstanbul Bus Station in European side).

if your flight arrives in the Asian side, text us before you book your bus tickets. Because it is a bit complicated. So you will need our help.

Once you arrive in Sinop, we will pick you up from the airport or the bus station.

PRACTICALITIES:



Attention!!!!

WARNING 1: Not only Sinop, but also the whole Black Sea coast has rip currents. A rip is a strong, localized, and narrow current of water which moves directly away from the shore, cutting through the lines of breaking waves like a river running out to sea. A rip current is strongest and fastest nearest the surface of the water. Rip currents can be hazardous to people in the water. Rip current speeds as high as 8 feet per second have been measured--faster than an Olympic swimmer can sprint! This makes rip currents especially dangerous to beachgoers as these currents can sweep even the strongest swimmer out to sea.

In order to prevent this risk: On the first day of your arrival, we will warn you against the rip currents. When the sea is too wavy, there might be rip currents. We will explain to you how rip current can be observed from the shore. In case you are caught by the rip current, we will tell you to stay calm. It's not going to pull you underwater; it's just going to pull you away from shore. Call and wave for help. You should float, and don't swim back to shore against the rip current because it will just tire you out. You can swim parallel to the shore instead. However, there are beaches without rip currents. We will show you the safe beaches so that you will still enjoy swimming. In the APV and the AAs, we will mention this risk that the volunteers must pay attention to.

WARNING 2: Scuba diving related risks:

Developing decompression sickness (DCS), or the bends. Nitrogen narcosis, or inert gas narcosis/ rapture of the deep /Martini effect. Barotrauma. Oxygen toxicity. Air or gas embolism.

* First of all, the volunteers who do not have the licence of the 2-star CMAS or EFR & PADI Diver level will certainly not dive. The ones who have these licences will have to show them to the instructors in order to dive. In order to have a licence, people need to have a doctor's confirmation. So you are expected to be healthy (no heart, ear, respiratory, etc. problems) and physically fit in order to dive.

*If you have a sore throat, flu, cold or congested ear or nose, you won't dive until you're well.

- * The ones who have these licences which are certified in their home countries are expected to know all the international rules for scuba divers such as never dive alone, -even if you dive with a group of people, find your buddy (diver friend), dive with him/her, be responsible for their safety, communicate with him or her in underwater sign language and confirm each other with "I am ok" signs frequently. You will make sure of each other if your buddy is equalizing their middle-ear pressure during descending.
- * The max diving depth will be 35 metres, which means that you will have to stop at a certain depth and a certain amount of time when you are ascending.
- * You will be accompanied by the professional scuba divers who have instructor licences and raise scuba divers. They will have the full responsibility under water and in each dive, there will be 5 instructors and each of them will be responsible for one or two pairs of divers. They will provide you safe diving, both the weather and the water are convenient for diving. The volunteers won't make a diving plan. Only the instructors will make the diving plan and you will follow their plan. When the instructor says "up", "stop", etc. you will obey these commands. You have to answer them with the "I am ok" sign. If you don't do that sign, the instructor will take you up to the surface.
- * When something goes wrong with you, they will act to rescue and save you. If you are exposed to air or gas embolism, you will be immediately taken to the hospital in Samsun, the city which is 2 hours away, where the nearest hyperbaric oxygen therapy is.
- * In order to prevent any kind of risks, even if you have scuba diving licences, the instructors will teach the basics of scuba diving in the classroom, remind you of the basic knowledge and tell you their rules. This course will take around 4 hours and the instructors will make sure if you understood everything with a small quiz at the end.
- *The equipment you will use belongs to the university's scuba diving club and the university pays special attention to their equipment and the safety of their students. So the equipment is regularly checked. The instructors will be responsible for checking them and making sure if every item is working well before diving. In the APV and in the AAs we will mention this risk and obeying the commands of the instructors will be a must.

Profile of the Volunteer

- Between 18 30 years' old
- Presenting their own culture in an innovative way with food/drinks/dance etc.
- Making the project visible in their country, social media and at the press.

For artists:

- Being either one of the followings: artist, musician, painter, sculpture, movie maker, animator etc.
- Getting inspired and delivering their work on time
- Working in teams
- •Willing to learn local crafts
- Willing to follow the "sharing model"

*In the sharing model, the artist comes to Sinop only with their suitcase. They feel the air, explore the town and get inspired. Then they perform their activity by using only local materials in a very short time. After that they will leave their work to us.

For scuba divers:

• scuba diving licence which will be either 2-star CMAS or EFR & PADI Diver level.

- ! Please read and sign your Activity Agreement
- •Bring your clothes according to these temperatures (25-30 degrees)
- •Come to Turkiye with Euros, not with your national money. Because it is very difficult to exchange other currencies into Turkish Lira except at the Istanbul Airport and a few exchange officies and banks in Istanbul. However you can exchange euros into Turkish Lira everywhere in Turkiye.
- Keep all of your travel documents: tickets and boarding passes in order to be reimbursed.
- •Bring cultural objects such as music, food, drinks, etc. for the cultural nights. No power point, please.
- •Bring sun cream and your swimming suits.


Sinop Turkiye
